

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




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## Size of Government


## Rule of Law

  - ▶ e.g. Somalia


### Rule of Law and Accumulation



# Definition (Kleptocracy or Ruling Thieves) Situation in which government is used to enrich country's rulers. Fact (Roving Bandits *vs.* Stationary Bandits) *Mancur Olson's theory of state.*
