Attached please find your midterm results, as well as some summary stats for the entire cohort of students. Please note that your raw score from today -- the one you saw on your screen -- was increased by 2 points: one for the odd question about isocosts and isoquants which was my mistake to include in the exam in the first place, and two, for the fact that I confused some of you about the Mandza street problem. In any case, since I cannot see who had which problem, everyone's score has been increased. Please note that no one has been made worse off by that, and those people who encountered both questions, and I confused them with my explanations during the exam, have been adequately compensated.

The average *adjusted* no. of correct answers on the midterm was appr. 30, which translates appr. to 75 percent (of 100). This makes me happy because the exam was not very easy, neither was it very hard.

Your TA grade will be formed according to the grading table in the [syllabus](#). Please note that your TA grade is just half of your final grade in this exam. Please also note that I can give you a pop-up quiz at any point during the remainder of the semester.
